Victory Day Celebration with Mr. Julian Francis – A Friend of Bangladesh

On 15th December 2023 a special event was held to celebrate the 53rd Victory Day of Bangladesh. The occasion brought together students and staff to honour the sacrifices made to bring about the triumph of the Liberation War. The programme was opened by Izharul Hoque, Vice President of the Student Council and Master of Ceremonies. Mr Dewan Yazdani, organizer of the event, gave a speech of welcome to all those present. Then Professor Hew Gill, President of UCB, introduced the distinguished special guest for the occasion, Mr Julian Francis. Mr Francis was the coordinator of the Oxfam relief effort. in 1971, overseeing the relief work for more than 600,000 people during the Liberation War. In early 1972 he personally met with Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and advised on the reconstruction of transport links destroyed during the war. For his many contributions to Bangladesh Mr Francis was recognized by the government of Bangladesh as a Friend of the Liberation War and granted Bangladesh citizenship, he was also the first recipient of the Bangabandhu-Edward Heath Friendship Award, and was honoured with the OBE by Queen Elizabeth II.



Abdullah Bin Habib Choudhury, President of the Student Council, proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Francis. The closing speech of this remarkable event was given by Professor Muhammad Ismail Hossain, Dean of Academic Affairs, who reminded the audience that the sacrifices of the past should motivate all of us to strive for a better tomorrow.

As part of the celebrations for Victory Day students were invited to enter art and essay competitions by submitting works about the Liberation War and its impact on the people of the new nation. Certificates were presented by Professor Hew and Mr Francis to the winners and participants. Research on E-Waste by Prof Muhammad Ismail Hossain

Professor Muhammad Ismail Hossain, Dean of Academic Affairs, and Professor of Marketing in the Faculty of Business Studies, Dhaka University has been conducting extensive research into electronic or e-waste with his colleague Professor Nasrin Akter, also from Dhaka University. Together they published a series of articles in The Business Standard about the e-waste value chain of Bangladesh, covering how e-waste is handled formally and informally, who deals with e-waste, and how dealing with e-waste correctly can be good for national income and the environment.

Prof Ismail has warned that "Bangladesh is expected to encounter a huge problem of e-waste due to the enormous drive of the nation to be digitally ready.

Most of the e-waste is managed by informal channels which means the country faces significant health and environmental hazards, and is also losing substantial economic benefits." Prof Akter added "Integration of formal and informal processing channel is key to saving Bangladesh from the disastrous effects of pollution." Profs Ismail and Akter have proposed a model for policy makers to ensure effective e-waste management.





Free Accounting Workshop for Students and Friends

Students and friends from outside UCB were invited to attend a free accounting workshop entitled "Navigating the Nuances: Understanding the Bangladesh Accounting System" hosted by SBE Fintech Services. The session led by Mr Suman Chakraborty provided many valuable insights into the intricacies of accounting in the Bangladesh context by providing a deeper understanding of the regulatory framework, financial reporting standards, and practical aspects of accounting specific to Bangladesh. Many students study accounting as part of their Monash and University of London programmes so the question-and-answer session was particularly valuable.
