#### Monash Information and Progression Day

UCB was delighted to welcome Ms Jo Mithen, CEO Monash College, to our Dhaka campus for an information and progression day.

Ms Mithen spent the morning reviewing the UCB student performance data for 2023, Prof Muhammad Ismail Hossain, Dean of Academic Affairs, was happy to report that across the year pass rates had risen in MUFY to 97% and in MCD to 94%.

Parents and students were invited to join Ms Mithen and the UCB senior team for an event about progression from MUFY to MCD. Prof. Hew Gill, President & Provost of UCB moderated a lively panel discussion about Monash programs with Ms Mithen, Prof. Ismail and four former UCB students now studying their degrees at Monash University: Faiaz Maksudul Haque, Rafiad Ruhi Jewel, Afrida Nusaiba Masir, and Maliha Nashita Rahman.

The student panellists explained how studying at UCB enabled them to fast-track their international higher education journey through Monash pathway programs leading direct into the first or second year of their chosen degrees.

Prof. Hew said, "Offering students different pathways is really important because it means Bangladeshi students have time to develop the transferrable skills which will be essential for their future global success. UCB programs offer cost-efficient pathways and guaranteed entry to Monash University for Bangladeshi students from international or National Curriculum schools. Our internationally qualified faculty and personalized teaching prepares Bangladeshi students for a global education before they go overseas, and makes the UCB-Monash approach unique."

"Monash University is ranked 42nd in the 2024 QS World University Rankings", said Ms Jo Mithen. "Students globally compete to get into such a prestigious university, but successfully completing a Monash pathway program at UCB guarantees a place at Monash University. I encourage more Bangladeshi students to get informed about UCB pathway programs, and to improve their international academic and career prospects, right here in Bangladesh."

In the open Q&A session the UCB students now at Monash University explained how the teaching they received at UCB prepared them for admission to their degrees. After the panel discussion certificates were presented to UCB students who performed at the top of their cohorts in the most recent Monash assessments.

The event closed with students and parents meeting with the Monash College CEO and other experts for personal advice and academic counseling, exploration of the many generous Monash scholarships, and to discuss future careers in Bangladesh and overseas.

### **Commonwealth Day**

Students at UCB gathered together for an enlightening and engaging event to celebrate Commonwealth Day, and the diversity and unity of the Commonwealth nations planned by Shaikh Rafi Zulfiquer and anchored by Noushin Sharmile Khan.

The event featured short presentations about several Commonwealth nations, by students Jeba Fariha and SM Elmuz Zaman about Bangladesh, Noushin Sharmile Khan and Nafiul Hassan about Australia, Md. Samim Ibna Sattar and Affa Faiza Hasan about Canada, Fariha Karim and Ahmed Anisuzzaman Khan about the United Kingdom, and Abtahi Anan and Ayesha Sarrat Khan about Sri Lanka. The vibrant presentations written by UCB students showcased the unique characteristics and contributions of each nation to the Commonwealth community, and their very close links with Bangladesh, the land of many rivers. The students described the United Kingdom with its rich history and cultural heritage, the stunning landscapes of Canada and its hardy people, and the unique wildlife of Australia and the 'can-do' attitude of its citizens, and the beauties of Sri Lanka, the Pearl of the Indian Ocean. The audience learned much about the traditions, customs, and achievements that make all these countries integral parts of the Commonwealth family.

Attendees took part in an interactive quiz written by Nafiul Hassan which tested participants' knowledge about the Commonwealth and its 56 member countries, with a combined population of 2.4 billion people. Individual questions covered the long history of the Commonwealth, member countries, and shared values. The quiz sparked lively discussions about the shared inheritance of democracy, common law, respect for human rights, and fostered a deeper appreciation for the interconnectedness and diversity within the Commonwealth. Many of these themes were covered in the beautiful posters and artwork prepared and exhibited by Sharika Jannat Raitha, Muammar Shahriar and SM Elmuz Zama.



Prof Hew, President of UCB, made a short speech thanking the students for all the work that went into the presentations, quiz and exhibition about the Commonwealth, saying, "Commonwealth Day provides a wonderful opportunity for all of us to celebrate the rich tapestry of cultures and traditions within the Commonwealth. Today's exhibition, presentations and quiz have shown us the remarkable diversity of member nations and also underlined the importance of global citizenship and cross-cultural understanding that is fostered by the Commonwealth."

The event concluded with students reflecting on the significance of the Commonwealth in promoting peace, democracy, and prosperity across its member countries, and on the bonds that unite the peoples and nations of the Commonwealth across all the continents of the globe.



#### **UCB National Online Quiz**

Over 500 students registered for the quiz competition, representing 128 schools and colleges from across Bangladesh. Three students from UCB gave a speech on "Preliminary Knowledge on Environmental Pollution" and Mr. Dewan Yazdani, the Global Studies course leader, gave a speech in his capacity as the main guest of the event. Several other environmentalists and researchers also made presentations on various climate-related and environmental pollution issues as well. UCB students took an active part in the debate.

# **Special Grants and Scholarships for Students**

UCB is offering students a Special Combo Grant for Monash University pathway programs and University of London degrees under the direction of the London School of Economics until 30th June 2024.

Students who register for the Monash University Foundation Program (MUFY), and also for progression to the Monash Continuing Degree (MCD) Program or progression to a University of London degree under the direction of the London School of Economics (UoL-LSE) will benefit from big savings.


By registering for the Special Combo Grant, new MUFY students will be eligible for the following:

MUFY to MCD Special Combo Grant of US \$ 1580, that is a saving of 20% of MCD fees.

MUFY to UoL-LSE Special Combo Grant of US \$ 1491, that is a saving of 15% of the first year fees.

Please note this Special Combo Grant may also be combined with an academic merit scholarship up to a maximum of 40% of MCD fees or UoL-LSE first year fees.
