AFFORDABLE UK DEGREES IN BANGLADESH WITH UCB-UCLAN PARTNERSHIP

UCB has entered into partnership with the prestigious University of Central Lancashire (UCLan). UCLan is the fourth biggest university in the UK and is ranked in the top 7% of universities in the world.

The partnership agreement was signed by Mr Bob Kundanmal, Chairman of the UCB Board and Prof Catherine Jackson, Pro-Vice Chancellor of UCLan, in the presence of Education Minister Mohibul Hassan Chowdhury and H.E. Ms Sarah Cooke, British High Commissioner to Bangladesh.

UCB will launch full three-year degrees from UCLan later this year. The British degrees will be very affordable so that Bangladeshi students can get qualifications with high global recognition at low cost in Dhaka.

Education Minister Mohibul Hassan Chowdhury said: "We have to focus on enriching the nation's future workforce by empowering our youth with timely skills that align with the demands of not just the local but the global market. The partnership between UCB and UCLan is an ideal example of recognizing the need for global education, one that should be followed by others in the sector as well."





H.E. Sarah Cooke, British High Commissioner said: "Over half a million students globally are currently studying for a UK degree overseas, helping to boost their future job prospects. British higher education institutions are dedicated to providing accessible and high-quality higher education, building a brighter future for students around the world."

Prof Hew Gill, President & Provost of UCB, who is also British said, "I am delighted that we are bringing more world-class UK degrees to Bangladesh, and that students can stay local and learn global by completing UK university degrees right here in Dhaka.".

Any student who passes MUFY is guaranteed entry to Monash University which is ranked 37th in the world according to the QS World Ranking 2025.
