LONDON SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS OPEN DAY AT UCB

UCB held an open day in partnership with the London School of Economic (LSE) on 23rd September. The chief guest was Dr. James Abdey, Associate Professor in Statistics and Associate International Director at LSE. The event provided students with an in-depth overview of the prestigious University of London (UoL) degrees available at UCB, all of which teach the same world-class LSE curriculum that is studied by students in London.

Prof Hew Gill, President of UCB, opened the event with a speech explaining how international education gives Bangladeshi students the skills they need to succeed in their careers. Dr. James Abdey then made a presentation about how LSE designs its degree curriculums for students studying their degrees at UCB. 

UCB-BANGLADESH CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY SOCIETY WORKSHOP ON STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH

UCB and Bangladesh Clinical Psychology Society (BCPS) jointly organised a workshop for mental health counselors from universities, colleges, and schools in Dhaka on 21st September 2024. This workshop was to address the mental health impacts of the recent protests and related events among students. Ms. Marzia, UCB Student Support Head, co-facilitated the workshop with Ms. Zohora Parveen, Clinical Supervisor, Mental Health Service Department, HEI, Malaysia.

More than 20 counsellors registered for the workshop and completed a survey about the impact of the demonstrations. The session opened with a short speech and panel session with Prof Hew Gill, President of UCB, and the participants exchanged many interesting perspectives on how the student protests may have impacted mental health. Ms. Marzia then presented some interim findings from the survey and urged participants to contact colleagues to take part in the next phases of the research. Ms. Zohora discussed some effective strategies that counsellors could use to help students process their emotions after the protests, then participants took part in a group activity to design a psychological intervention to benefit students.





The participants said further sessions on relevant mental health topics were needed. Ms. Marzia from UCB is working closely with her colleagues in the BCPS to arrange a workshop on Trauma Management soon as part of UCB's ongoing collaborations with professional and educational institutions across the country.

BRIDGING HEARTS AT CHESHIRE HOMES UTTARA, DHAKA



On September 28, 2024, the sun shone brightly over Dhaka as UCB students, under the guidance of Mr. Dewan Md. Nur-A Yazdani, embarked on a meaningful mission to Cheshire Homes in Uttara. Ms. Marzia has been appointed as External Mental Health Professional (EMHP) to the UN and she will be facilitating future training sessions and workshops for the UN as part of UCB's commitment to developing human capital and skills across Bangladesh.
