PROF HEW GIVES KEYNOTE PRESENTATION AT BANGLADESH'S OLDEST INDEPENDENT UNIVERSITY



Porf Hew Gill, UCBD President & Provost, was invited by the International University of Business Agriculture and Technology (IUBAT) to give the keynote address at their Awards and Recognition Ceremony in December. IUBAT was the first private university ever established in Bangladesh and Prof Hew said: "It is a pleasure to represent the first international university in Bangladesh at the oldest independent university in Bangladesh.".

Prof Hew was accompanied by Ms Marzia Al-Hakeem, Student Support Head and Lecturer in Psychology, and Ms Sushama Mahmuda Ananna, Executive Coordinator and Lecturer in Psychology. The UCBD team met with Prof Dr Abdur Rab , Vice Chancellor, Professor Dr Mohammad Rahman, Pro-Vice Chancellor, Professor Dr Mohammad Rahman, Registrar, Brigadier General D. Md Zahid Hossain, Controller of Examinations, Professor Nargis Jahan from the Department of Psychology, and many other members of the academic faculty, and a very large number of students.

The subject of Prof Hew's presentation was "Prioritizing Mental Health in the Workplace" and his session was attended by a large number of academics and students from across IUBAT. Prof Hew spoke about some of the research that he has recently conducted on the differences in emotions between men and women from different parts of the world. He then reviewed the research evidence showing which types of activities and interventions are the most effective at supporting good mental health among academics and students. Prof Hew also explained how the latest science is used to design student support activities at UCBD. Professor Dr Mohammad Rahman, Pro-Vice Chancellor of IUBAT, gave the vote of thanks to Prof Hew and presented him with tokens of appreciation. Prof Hew said, "A very big thank you to all the IUBAT organising committee for such a wonderful event and ensuring that everything ran so smoothly. We look forward to seeing all our IUBAT friends again very soon, and arranging a visit to the UCBD campus.".

UCBD WORKSHOP AT UNIVERSITY OF DHAKA



UCBD's Student Support Head and Lecturer in Psychology, Ms. Marzia Al-Hakeem conducted a workshop in the Department of Clinical Psychology at the University of Dhaka on 14th December 2024. The session was part of a series organized by the Department of Clinical Psychology (DUCP), University of Dhaka and Bangladesh Clinical Psychology Society (BCPS) to observe World Mental Health Day. In 2024, 10 workshops were conducted by different clinical psychologists.

Ms. Marzia conducted her workshop on Enhancing Life Skills. The main objective of the workshop was to inform people about the significance of life skills in all spheres of life. The World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF and UNESCO suggest that there are 10 core life skills, and each was introduced in the session. The participants enjoyed and engaged with the session because the skills were introduced with practical life examples, group activities and role playing. The participants gave feedback that they were aware of these skills, but through the workshop, they could relate to them better in their personal and professional lives.

The DUCP and BCPS regularly organize different workshops and training programs as part of their mass mental health awareness and prevention initiatives. As Ms. Marzia is a clinical psychologist and a clinical supervisor for the trainee clinical psychologists of DUCP, she frequently gets invited to conduct workshops and training sessions at the University of Dhaka. UCBD looks forward to maintaining this partnership between UCBD, DU and BCPS through organizing joint workshops on different mental health issues in future.

Cookie decorating is one of the ancient Christmas traditions, dating back to the 14th century Switzerland, where intricately carved wooden molds called Springerle were used to impress designs onto cookies. The oldest known Springerle mold is preserved at the Swiss National Museum in Zurich, showcasing the rich history of this artistic practice.
