She graced us with her presence in USC's celebration of International Day for Women and Girls in Science on the 11th of February 2025. The virtual session with Samreen turned into an interactive discussion, making every moment feel like a personal conversation with the curious students.

Samreen shared her journey as a young scientist in STEM, breaking down research methodologies and unveiling global opportunities for aspiring scientists. The Q&A session was a hit, with students eagerly firing questions about career paths, challenges, and cutting-edge research.



It was impressive that the turnout of male students equaled the female students, and they didn't seem to feel out of place and were rather excited to attend. We even got a rare close-up look at rocks from the Moon and Mars, straight from the *Smithsonian Museum*!

Beyond the insights, the event had an exciting lineup of activities that kept students engaged in the true celebration of ambition and the endless possibilities waiting in STEM. Sciencethemed games like "Would you rather" sparked curiosity, encouraging students to think critically about which scientific career they would rather have and why. To add more appeal, students designed "Women in Science" cupcakes, each carrying one female character with a STEM career and an empowering message: "Your career should feed you."

On February 20, UCBD students gathered in solemn remembrance, dressed in black and white, to honor the brave souls of the Language Movement. The Student Lounge on Level 6 was transformed into a space of reflection, where students and faculty paid tribute to those who sacrificed their lives for our right to speak in our mother tongue.

At the heart of the event stood a beautifully crafted Shaheed Minar model, surrounded by paper flowers and Bengali alphabets, symbolizing respect and remembrance. Professor Ismail Hossain, Dean of Academic Affairs, encouraged students to embrace their linguistic heritage, while Nivan Nur Yamin's heartfelt Bengali speech emphasized the power of our mother tongue.

The emotion deepened as a short, animated film brought the struggles of 1952 to life, followed by Sarina and Najah's moving poetry recitations that echoed the pain and pride of the movement.

The event reached its crescendo as voices united to sing "Amar Bhai Er Rokte Rangano Ekushey February," filling the room with the undying spirit of Ekushey. More than a tribute, the gathering was a powerful reminder of cultural pride, unity, and the legacy that lives on in every spoken word of our mother tongue.
